

The Rainbow Roam is maintained by the volunteers of the Community Partners of Montgomery County, a local non-profit organization. The Rainbow Room is stocked with supplies such as clothing, shoes, dispers, baby formula, hygiene products, lice shampoo, toys, books, car courts, backgrarks, and similar thems for newhorn to 17-years old. 
